
THE START OF HALLOWE'EN

Hallowe'en began about 2,000 years ago in Ireland. People believed that on one night each year, 31 October, the spirits of the dead walked in towns and villages. Rather than honour their dead relatives as in some cultures, the people were afraid. They dressed in costumes to scare away the spirits and stay safe.




THE START OF HALLOWE'EN

1,200 years ago the Christian church moved All Saints Day to 1 November. This is a day when the spirits of dead relatives are celebrated. The night before 1 November was called All Hallows Eve, when people scared away bad spirits so they could welcome good spirits were celebrated on All Saints Day. All Hallows Eve was later called Hallowe'en.




HALLOWE'EN TODAY


